
Travel with Rich and Chris



Mozambique & South Africa:

From Gorongosa to the Greater Kruger Region

13 Days | August 15 - 27, 2025

Explore two amazing safari destinations on one journey: Gorongosa National Park in Mozambique and the Greater Kruger region of South Africa. Considered to be one of Africa's greatest wildlife restoration stories, today Gorongosa is one of the most biodiverse places in the world. With few visitors compared to other parks, the vast wilderness of Gorongosa offers an intimate and authentic safari experience far from the crowds. Then, visit two distinct ecosystems in the Greater Kruger area, Makuleke Contractual Park in the far north, and Mala Mala Game Reserve, set between Kruger National Park and Sabi Sand Game Reserve. Each area offers a variety of unique and incredibly scenic habitats that host a diversity of African wildlife, both large and small. Embark on morning and afternoon safaris in the company of expert naturalists who will share their deep knowledge of the wonders you will witness.

Itinerary

FRIDAY, AUGUST 15 2025

Johannesburg, South Africa

Arrive in Johannesburg and transfer to the InterContinental O.R. Tambo Airport Hotel. After a chance to freshen up, join your expeditions leaders and fellow travelers for a welcome dinner at the hotel.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 16

Johannesburg / Beira / Gorongosa National Park, Mozambique

After breakfast, board our flight to Mozambique. Upon arrival, depart overland to Gorongosa National Park, located at the southern end of the Great Rift Valley. With an eye toward sustainable tourism and minimal environmental impact, camps here are small, many with just a handful of tents. Our group will be split between Muzimu Tented Camp and Wild Camp, both of which provide airy tents set in the heart of the wilderness.

SUNDAY - TUESDAY, AUGUST 17 - 19Gorongosa National Park

Embark on twice-daily safaris to search for the park's abundant wildlife. In addition to iconic species such as elephants, lions, hippos, and crocodiles, the park is also home to African wild dogs, and several species of antelope such as waterbuck, nyala, greater kudu, bushbuck, impala, oribi and sable antelope. With more than 300 recorded species, birds we may spy include African fish eagles, green headed orioles, gray



crowned cranes, Goliath herons, red-necked spurfowl, and flashy lilac-breasted rollers. After an exciting day in the bush, return to camp to recount our adventures around the campfire and enjoy dinner under the stars.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 20

Gorongosa National Park / Beira / Kruger National Park (Pafuri), South Africa

Time permitting, embark on a morning safari before returning to Beira to catch our flight to South Africa. Transfer to Pafuri Tented Camp, set in Makuleke Contractual Park in the northernmost section of Kruger between the Limpopo and Luvuvhu rivers. Check in to your luxurious tent, set on a raised wooden platform, and perhaps take a rest on your own private veranda.

THURSDAY & FRIDAY, AUGUST 21 & 22 Northern Kruger National Park (Pafuri)

This area of the park is geologically unique and offers a multitude of habitats, resulting in a region of extraordinary scenic beauty and biodiversity. One of the most diverse within the whole of Kruger, this area is home to almost three quarters of the Park's bird, mammal, fish, amphibian, reptile, and tree species. It has also long been regarded a destination of choice for southern African birdwatchers. Makuleke has over 350 recorded species of birds and is internationally renowned for its diversity, including many seldom seen species such as Pel's fishing owl, wattle-eyed flycatcher, three-banded courser, African crowned eagles, and racket-tailed rollers. We'll embark on twice-daily game drives to explore a variety of habitats searching for species such as hippo, crocodile, eland, grysbok, and of course elephant. In the evening, go on a spotlighting drive to view nocturnal creatures such as lesser bush babies, genets, and civets. We'll also get up close to some of the region's smaller inhabitants on guided bush walks.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 23

Kruger National Park / Mala Mala

After breakfast and a morning game-viewing activity, board our charter flight to Mala Mala, one of the largest private Big Five game reserves in South Africa, strategically set between Kruger and Sabi Sand

Reserve. Check in to Mala Mala Camp, a haven of understated luxury overlooking the Sand River and surrounding bushveld. Take a dip in the infinity pool, grab a drink at the iconic Buffalo Bar, or enjoy some quiet time in the air-conditioned library, before your first game drive. Return for dinner by the fire in a traditional reed "boma," then retire to your large, well-appointed thatched hut, and perhaps indulge in some star gazing from your private veranda.

SUNDAY – TUESDAY, AUGUST 24 – 26 Mala Mala

Enjoy twice-daily game drives in open Land Rovers offering you unrivaled and unobstructed vistas of this famed landscape. Known for its high density of wildlife, including the Big Five—elephant, lion, leopard, buffalo, and rhino, the reserve's proximity to the Sand and Sabie Rivers also means that water-based wildlife is abundant, enhancing the diversity of sightings.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 27

Mala Mala / Johannesburg / Depart

Time permitting, enjoy one last game drive, then transfer to the air strip for our flight to Johannesburg and connect with your independent homeward flight. Or, continue your explorations on an optional post-extension to view annual Wildflower Bloom and go whale watching in De Hoop Reserve.

7 Nights | August 29-Sept 3, 2025

This well-timed post-extension captures the beauty of spring fynbos bloom in Namaqua National Park and the southern right whale migration near De Hoop Nature Reserve. Wander through fields of unique and colorful wildflowers, exclusive to this region. Enjoy a stay at the luxurious Babylonstoren Wine Estate in Franschhoek, known as South Africa's food and wine capital. Continue your journey to the vast De Hoop Nature Reserve, a sanctuary for breeding southern right whales, Bryde's and humpback whales, dolphins, and a variety of birds, including the endangered Cape vulture.

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 27, 2023

Mala Mala / Cape Town

Time permitting, enjoy one last game drive, then transfer to the Kruger Mpumalanga Airport and board our flight to Cape Town. Check in to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

THURSDAY. AUGUST 28

Cape Town / Namaqua National Park

After breakfast, depart overland for Namaqua National Park, with a stop for lunch en route. Check in to Namaqua Nature Camp. Located right on the beach, all tents have a captivating sea view and plenty of comfy spots for sundowners.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 29

Namaqua National Park

In August and September, Namaqualand transforms into a colorful wonderland, carpeted with wildflowers like daisies, lilies, aloes, vygies, and herbs. This biodiversity hotspot is home to over 3,500 plant species, with 1,000 being unique to the area, and boasts the world's largest concentration of succulent plants. Explore viewpoints by car and hike through vast fields to see the blooms up close. If fortunate, we may spot the Namaqua speckled padloper, the world's tiniest tortoise.

SATURDAY, AUGUST 30

Namaqua National Park / Wine Region

This morning, leave for South Africa's renowned Wine Region, stopping for lunch on the way. Check in at Babylonstoren Wine Estate, a historic Cape Dutch farm nestled at the base of Simonsberg Peak in Franschhoek wine valley. Tonight's dinner includes freshly-baked bread, garden-fresh produce, and locally-sourced proteins paired with carefully chosen wines.

SUNDAY, AUGUST 31

Wine Region / De Hoop Nature Reserve

After breakfast, take a guided walking tour of the estate's gardens to see unique cultivated plants. Savor a farm-fresh lunch before heading to the 84,000-acre De Hoop National Park, renowned as the "jewel of the Western Cape." Relax at Lekkerwater Beach Lodge in bright, airy cabins with floor-to-ceiling windows and private decks, offering breathtaking ocean views.



MONDAY & TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 1 & 2

De Hoop Nature Reserve

Explore the remarkable De Hoop coastal reserve for two days, renowned for world-class land-based whale watching from July to November. This Marine Protected Area since 1985 teems with sea life, including dolphins, seals, and over 260 bird species, boasting the Western Cape's sole breeding colony of endangered Cape vultures.

Enjoy a De Vlei Wetlands cruise, spotting eland, bontebok, Cape Mountain zebra, gray rhebuck, duiker, and the endangered African oystercatcher. During low tide, discover captivating tide pools and the diverse coastal fynbos.
